The Adventures of Tulane's All-American Candidate Grace Daley

Grace's 1999-00 Highlights

- * As of the most recent NCAA statistical release, Grace is the **nation's leading scorer** at 26.4 points per game.
- * Grace was named Conference USA Player of the Week on Monday, Dec. 13, making her the **only player in C-USA history** to earn the recognition in four consecutive years.
- * Grace has scored **at least 20 points** in each of Tulane's seven wins so far this season, including back-to-back 30-point efforts against Texas A&M (33) and SMU (35).
- * With her 35 points against SMU, Grace now has 1,742 career points and needs just 339 to pass Stacey Gaudet (2,080 pts) to become the **all-time leading scorer** in school history. She already ranks as the second-leading scorer in Conference USA history.
- * She recorded her first double-double of the season, and the second of her career, with 33 points and 13 rebounds against Texas A&M (Dec. 8). She also added five assists and two steals while committing just one turnover in 35 minutes of work. She just missed her second consecutive double-double when she scored 35 points and grabbed nine rebounds against SMU (Dec. 13).

Of the five individual awards handed out by Conference USA, Tulane's Grace Daley is the only player in league history to claim as many as four of them. In fact, only one other player has won two different C-USA awards - Tulane's own Janell Burse, who was named Sixth Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year this past season. Daley has also been selected to each of the three teams named by Conference USA.
